



Ninth Workshop for Young economists: 18-19 August 2022

Call for papers

The Lima School of Economics and the Economics Department of Universidad de Piura (UDEP), in collaboration with Vancouver School of Economics (University of British Columbia) are pleased to announce the ninth UDEP Workshop for Young Economists. This academic event is organized every two years. Since its first edition, almost 60 economists, affiliated to universities in North America and Europe have presented research papers included in their PhD dissertations.

In 2022, it will be held on August 18-19, at the Lima campus of UDEP. Economists who have recently completed their PhD dissertation (after 2020) or who expect completion by the end of the 2022-2023 academic year, and who have not participated in this workshop before, are invited to submit one of their papers or extended abstracts by June 19th, 2022, 5:00 PM, Peru Standard Time (GMT -5). Approximately eight papers will be selected. Peruvian nationals are encouraged to apply, as well as researchers whose work focuses on Peru or Latin America. Papers in any field of economics are welcome. However, since the workshop intends to provide participants with high-quality feedback, organizers will aim to select a group of applicants with common research interests. The Department of Economics of UDEP will reimburse presenters up to US\$800 for air tickets.

Each presentation will last 50 minutes, followed by a 30-minute discussion led by a designated senior researcher, who could also take questions from the audience. Accepted applicants will be expected both to present their own research and to productively engage in the discussions following all other presentations. Early reading of the other accepted papers will hence be strongly encouraged. The Workshop will also include a keynote address.
